Rory asked to provide a public health perspective around cardiovascular disease and stroke prevention, as part of the Hampshire Healthy Hearts programme.</p> <p>Estimated fee of £175.00 per hour - with 2 hours for meeting and questions and 3 hours preparation. Approximately 5 hours in total £875.00. This would be undertaken in Dr Honney's own time/ personal capacity and the fees would be directly payable to him.</p> <p>Associate Director of Medicines Optimisation was asked to provide advice and on 20 October indicated that this was appropriate, as it is Dr Honney's area of expertise and is a priority area for the CCG, and worthy of promotion.</p> <p>It was confirmed that Dr Honney is not involved in the development of the local anticoagulation guidelines and it is noted the CCG already recommends edoxaban as preferred DOAC (anti-coagulant) which is a Daiichi Sankyo (DS) product.</p> <p>Following further enquiries about any other project work locally and any other links Dr Honney may have with the company, it was noted that DS has an Academic Health Science Network (AHSN) approved app called Fibrichk that uses one's smart phone to</p>

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				<p>detect pulse irregularity and are looking for pilot sites in Hampshire, identifying Andover as potential location.</p> <p>The company already has several other sites nationally including one in Oxford (Strategic Clinical Network CVD) to understand implementation. The benefit to the patient population is free licences for the app and improved detection, to close the prevalence gap. Dr Honney's role (in various capacities) has only been to link DS to the Primary Care Network (PCN) and the PCN will decide if they want to take up the opportunity on behalf of their patients.</p> <p>It was confirmed that Dr Honney is not a PCN board member so is not involved in any decision-making process. Andover is a good PCN to pilot this work this due to clear boundaries and effective practice collaboration in a manageable geography. It is also one of our more deprived communities so by drawing in support for it, he is fulfilling his role as locality director and applying the principles of vertical equity to even out unwarranted variation in outcomes.</p> <p>Accepted (approved by Associate Director, Medicines Optimisation and Chief Operating Officer)</p>
